

## Dr. Laëtitia Michou

Dr. Michou has completed her medicine studies at the University of Angers (France) in 1998, her Rheumatology residency at the Denis Diderot-Paris VII University (France) in 2005 and her PhD in Human Genetics at the René Descartes-Paris V University (France) in 2007. She had in parallel completed a clinical fellowship of two years (2005-2007) in fragility bone diseases at the centre Viggo Petersen, Rheumatology department, Lariboisière hospital, Assistance publique-Hôpitaux de Paris, France.

Dr. Michou is a clinical investigator at the Centre de Recherche du CHU de Québec and rheumatologist at the CHU de Québec since November 2007, and associate professor at the Department of Medicine of the Laval University, Quebec. Dr Michou is the principal investigator of several academic research projects in the field of bone diseases. She supervises master and PhD students, as well as clinical research projects of rheumatology and internal medicine residents.

She is the author or coauthor of 65 scientific refereed articles, more than 120 oral or poster communications in scientific congresses, and 38 articles of medical continuing education for rheumatologists or family doctors.

Research interests of Dr. Michou are human genetics of bone and joint diseases, particularly Paget's disease of bone, rare bone diseases, osteoporosis, and rheumatoid arthritis.
